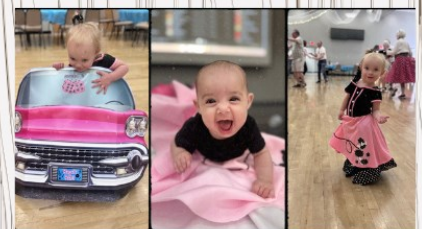

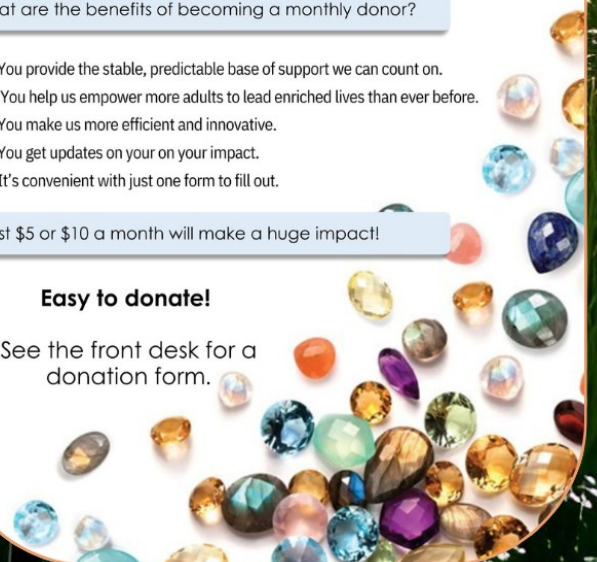

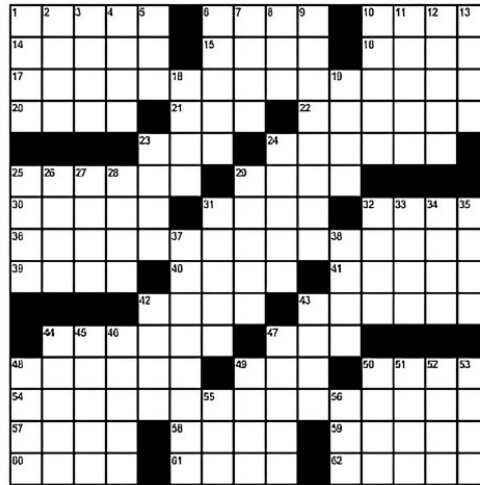

Recipe: Pasta Caprese Salad

Salad

- 1lb small pasta
- 16oz mozzarella balls
- 3 cups cherry tomatoes
- ½ cup thinly sliced basil

Dressing

- ⅓ cup extra virgin olive oil
- 3 TBSP white balsamic vinegar
- 1 tsp kosher salt
- 1 tsp black pepper
- 1 clove garlic, minced

1. Cook pasta according to the package instructions.
2. Prepare the Mozzarella & Tomatoes - slice the mozzarella & cherry tomatoes in half. - Add to a mixing bowl
3. Combine ingredients - Once pasta has cooled add it to the mixing bowl with the mozz. and tomatoes. Toss in the thinly sliced basil.
4. Make the dressing - in a small bowl or mason jar, combine the dressing ingredients- mix or shake well
5. Dress the Salad- Drizzle the prepared dressing over the pasta salad in the mixing bowl. Toss together gently - SERVE

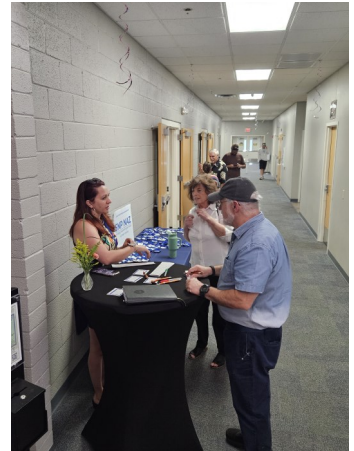
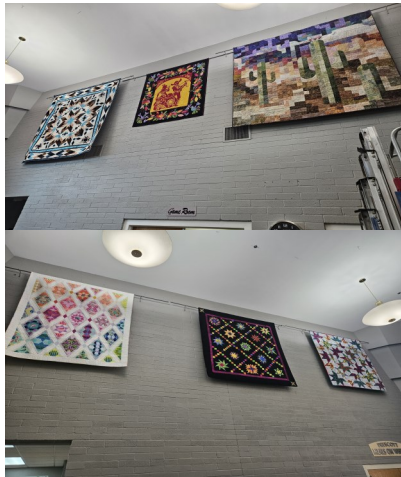
